



### ♦ CHARGES AGAINST LAWYER DISMISSED

Here's an update on a story we first reported in March. Judge Casey Stokes of Meigs County has dismissed charges of aggravated child abuse filed against Lookout Mountain attorney Morgan Adams. Adams had been accused of giving his 11-year-old son 100 licks with a fly swatter for getting zeroes in school and for lying to his mother. The case was moved to Meigs County after all Hamilton County judges recused themselves. Judge Stokes dismissed the charges and ordered the charges to be expunged from Adams' record.

#### ♦ GENTLEMEN, START YOUR DUCKS!

The 2015 Athens Parks Foundation's "Dueling Duck" Race takes place tomorrow afternoon at Athens Regional Park. One-thousand ducks will be dumped from the Highway 30 bridge into Mouse Creek.
