◆ "BOOZE IT AND LOSE IT"

The Athens Police Department is taking part in the statewide "Booze It and Lose It" campaign this Labor Day weekend. Officers will conduct saturation patrols Friday night and throughout the Labor Day weekend. Police will also increase their walk-in checks of establishments that serve alcohol. Tennessee experienced 6,645 alcohol-related crashes last year.
