♦ TVA FINISHES UNIT 2 SAFETY TEST

TVA has completed a week long safety test of the Watts Bar Unit 2 reactor. The test verified that the safety systems designed to shut down the reactor work properly, even when relying on a backup system of diesel generators. TVA hopes to have Unit 2 in operation within the next few months. Meantime, the Unit 1 reactor at Watts Bar has been taken off-line for refueling. While refueling is taking place, workers will be performing routine maintenance.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The House Chamber was packed Thursday morning as Pope Francis addressed a joint session of Congress. The pontiff structured much of his historic speech by highlighting the work and lives of President Abraham Lincoln, the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., Dorothy Day, the founder of the Catholic Worker Movement, and Thomas Merton, a U.S. Catholic writer.

◆ A tourist duck boat collided with a charter bus in Seattle on Thursday, leaving four dead and at least nine others critically injured.

◆ Stocks fell Thursday as investors grow concerned over the Fed's decision to keep interest rates unchanged. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 78.57 at 16,201.32. The Nasdaq lost 18.27 to end at 4,734.48, while the S&P 500 finished the session down 6.52 at 1,932.24.

TODAY IN HISTORY - September 25

1513 - Spanish explorer Vasco Balboa became the first European to see the eastern shore of the Pacific Ocean. He viewed it from a mountain in Panama, called it the South Sea, and claimed it for Spain.

1690 - The first newspaper to be published in America appeared in Boston. It was called "Publick Occurances, Both Foreign and Domestic." The newspaper was short-lived. Authorities considered it to be offensive and ordered the publisher to cease publishing.

1789 - Congress adopted 12 amendments to the original constitution. Ten of them became known as "The Bill of Rights." Most of them guarantee personal rights.

1897 - Author William Faulkner was born. He wrote some of his novels about a fictional county in the state of Mississippi. His works include "The Sound and the Fury."

1929 - Barbara (Ann) Walters was born. Her TV roles have included 20/20, the ABC News Tonight, and The View. **1956** - The first transatlantic telephone service was officially opened. The cable ran from Newfoundland to Scotland, a distance of 2,250 miles. It was designed to carry 36 conversations at the same time. The rate for a transatlantic phone call was \$12 for a three-minute call.

1969 - Actress Catherine Zeta-Jones was born. Her movies include The Phantom, The Mask of Zorro, The Young Indiana Jones Chronicles, & Entrapment.

1981 - Sandra Day O'Connor was sworn in as the first female justice on the U.S. Supreme Court.

2011 - Two American hikers held for more than two years in an Iranian prison, returned to the United States.
