Susan Hayes says she noticed a woman standing on the sidewalk apparently in distress. The woman, Annalisa Grossman, told her she could feel her baby coming. Haves got her inside the store, and employees handed her scissors, gloves, and other supplies she needed to deliver the baby. Within a matter of minutes, the baby was born. Amelia Grossman was three months early and weighed just 2 pounds and 14 ounces. Both mother and baby are doing fine. Susan Hayes has no medical training, and says she had only helped deliver kittens and puppies until Tuesday. She says she's glad to have been in the right place at the right time to help someone in distress.

- ◆ Authorities say they are still searching for a motive after a heavilyarmed man and his wife opened fire at an office holiday party in San Bernardino, California, on Wednesday. Fourteen people were killed and 21 others were wounded in one of the deadliest mass shootings in U.S. history.
- ◆ State Representative John Holsclaw, a Republican from Elizabethton, plans to introduce legislation in the Tennessee Legislature to ban talking on a cellphone while driving, unless it is in handsfree mode.
