Local & Area News

◆ COST OF WATTS BAR UNIT 2 GOES UP

The cost of the Watts Bar Nuclear Plant Unit 2 reactor is going up another \$200 million. TVA directors have voted to add that amount to the budget, which will raise the total completion cost to \$4.7 billion since work was re-started in 2007. A spokesman for TVA says the cost rose in part because of delays in completion and extra flood controls and emergency equipment required to prevent an accident like the one that happened at Fukushima, Japan.

◆ RINGSTAFF GETS BOOTED IN CLEVELAND

The Cleveland City School Board voted Friday afternoon to terminate Dr. Martin Ringstaff as their director of schools. Ringstaff was the center of controversy last week after a Twitter account surfaced featuring explicit text message between Ringstaff and an unidentfied woman. Ringstaff first said the Twitter messages were phony, but later admitted that he was the one that sent them.

◆ TENNESSEE CALLS FOR CONVENTION

Tennessee lawmakers have voted with four other states calling for a convention to amend the U.S. Constitution which would be limited to fiscal and jurisdictional restraints on the federal government and instituting terms limits for members of Congress.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ The Federal Aviation Administration has issued suspensions or letters of reprimand to more than a dozen air traffic controllers for texting, taking selfies, showing explicit material to others, and using Snapchat on the job. In almost every case, no one was fired.
- ◆ The Virginia Tech student, 18-year-old David Eisenhauer, charged with kidnapping and murdering a 13-year-old girl is suspected of having a relationship with the victim that a source characterizes as "inappropriate."
- ◆ North Korea launched a long-range missile Saturday that passed over Japan and landed in the Yellow Sea. The launch was "strongly" and unanimously condemned by members of the United Nations Security Council Sunday.
- A slowdown in job creations in January caused a market slide on Wall Street Friday. All markets declined including oil.


