♦ ETOWAH TIGHTENS DOG RULES

The City of Etowah says a recent dog bite incident is forcing them to take a stronger policy on dog registration. Etowah banned pit bulls in 2012. However, the ordinance allowed prior owners of pit bulls to keep their dogs as long as they bought a \$100,000 liability insurance policy, kept the dogs muzzled on short leashes when outside of the home, and to keep the dogs confined indoors or in a locked pen or kennel while at home. There was a biting incident involving a pit bull that happened last Wednesday. As a result, the City of Etowah is now requiring residents who adopt a new dog to register them at City Hall and have them photographed to provide proof they are not violating the pit bull ban.

- ✓ Power crews from Athens Utilities Board will begin upgrading lines, power poles, and associated hardware on South Jackson Street from the Oostanaula Creek bridge to Wayne Road tomorrow. Crews will replace aging, single-strand wire, with a more robust wire and will replace several aging power poles, moving them further away from the street for safety purposes. Power will be shut off to one or two houses at a time for a few minutes as crews make the new connections. The project plan does not include closing South Jackson Street at any time during the work.
- The Meigs County Election Commission will meet tonight at 7 in the Election Office to certify the March 1st Presidential Preference Primary and the Meigs County Primary Election.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- On Sunday, a Maryland police officer killed in the line of duty, was inadvertently shot by a fellow responding officer after a gunman allegedly ambushed a police station house in an "unprovoked" attack. The gunman was wounded in the ensuing shootout and is expected to survive.
- Floodwaters are receding in northwest Louisiana, and emergency officials along Louisiana's southeastern border with Mississippi are watching the rise of the Pearl River which could reach 21 feet by late Tuesday or early Wednesday.
- ◆ A suicide car bomb exploded near bus stops in the heart of Turkey's capital on Sunday, killing at least 34 people and wounding about 125 others.
