◆ JET ENGINE COVER FOUND IN CALHOUN

The engine cover that fell off a Delta passenger jet over Bradley County last Sunday afternoon has been found near Calhoun. The cover fell in two pieces which were found in cow pastures about a mile apart. One piece landed in a pasture on the Barham Jersey Farm. The cover fell off when the jet ran into heavy turbulence. FAA representatives visited the scene



on Thursday to look at the pieces. The plane made an emergency landing in Nashville. At least one person reported seeing an object falling from a plane as it flew over Sunday afternoon.

◆ AMBER ALERT CHILD FOUND OKAY

Carlie Trent, the 9-year-old girl from Rogersville, who had been missing for more than a week after her non-custodial uncle, Gary Simpson, picked her up from school under false pretenses, has been found. Carlie and Simpson were found in a remote area of Hawkins County, near the Hancock County line. Dispatchers said someone called 911 on Thursday, reporting the sighting, and deputies were dispatched to that location.

◆ White House Press Secretary Josh Earnest is urging Congress not to take its Memorial Day recess until funding to combat the Zika virus is approved.

◆ Likely Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump met Thursday with party leadership. Speaker Paul Ryan and Trump issued a joint statement calling for Republicans to "unite around our shared principles."

◆ Bernie Sanders' campaign has replaced its California state director less than a month before the state votes in its primary. Sanders said that winning the Golden State is "imperative" to his long-shot effort to overtake rival Hillary Clinton in the race for delegates. The California primary is June 7th.

1842 - Composer Sir Arthur Sullivan was born. Along with William S. Gilbert, he wrote some of the most popular operettas in the history of the English theater, including "The Pirates of Penzance" and "The Mikado." Sullivan also composed the music for the hymn "Onward, Christian Soldiers."

1893 - Alvin "Shipwreck" Kelly was born. In the 1920's, he became the champion flagpole-sitter of all time. In 1930, he stayed atop a flagpole at Atlantic City, New Jersey, for more than 49 days.

1918 - The U.S. Postal Service issued the first airmail stamp.

1940 - Singer Ritchie Valens was born. His biggest hit record was "Donna." He died in the plane crash that took the lives of Buddy Holly and The Big Bopper aka J.P. Richardson.

1950 - Singer Stevie Wonder was born. His hit records include "You Are The Sunshine Of My Life" and "I Just Called To Say I Love You."

2003 - The government unveiled a new version of the \$20 bill - the first to be colorized in an effort to thwart counterfeiters.
