- ◆ With about four months left in office, the clock is running as the Obama administration again nears a chance to broker a resolution to the brutal civil war in Syria. The latest proposal by President Obama hinges on the daunting task of convincing warring parties to lay down arms without any political resolution in sight, and an unlikely U.S. military alliance with Russia.
- ◆ Dozens of people were forced to spend the night in several cable cars that are stuck high up in the French Alps after rescue efforts were suspended due to the dark.
- ◆ Libertarian presidential nominee Gary Johnson, drew a blank during a live interview on MSNBC Thursday morning when asked what he would do to address the situation in Aleppo. Johnson didn't know it's the city at the epicenter of the refugee crisis in Syria.

1754 - British seaman William Bligh was born. He became famous after a mutiny took place on his ship, "The Bounty." He and 18 members of his crew were forced off the ship and drifted 3,600 miles in the South Pacific before being rescued.

1776 - The Second Continental Congress officially changed the new American nation's name from "United Colonies" to "United States".

1836 - Abraham Lincoln received his license to practice law.

1896 - The first successful heart surgery was performed in Germany on a patient who had been stabbed in the heart during a fight.

1926 - The National Broadcasting Company (NBC) was organized as a broadcasting service of the Radio Corporation of America.
