◆ E & E ANNOUNCES BIG EXPANSION

◆ MAYOR DAVIS CALLS OUT OPPONENTS

Athens Mayor Ann Davis ended Tuesday night's City Council meeting by speaking out against some of her critics. Mayor Davis said there is a small segment of the community that think they are the only ones capable of running the city government. She said they believe that the majority of decisions made by the city council, the city manager, and some department heads are wrong. Mayor Davis said, they offer mostly inaccurate criticism and no solutions except "throw the rascals out." She also said they spread misleading and sometimes false information on Facebook. She singled out Larry Eaton as a leader of the opposition. Mayor Davis then adjourned the meeting. Following the adjournment, Councilman Dick Pelley expressed his support for Larry Eaton.
