FIRES WREAK HAVOC IN GATLINBURG

TEMA reports that hundreds of structures have been destroyed by the wildfires in Sevier County. Black Bear Falls reportedly lost every cabin. Westgate Resorts is said to be gone, with more than 100 buildings burned. Three people have now died from severe burns. Several firefighters from the Athens area are helping to battle the fires. The Athens Fire Department sent a crew and its ladder truck. Firefighters from Englewood, Niota, and Meigs County are also helping. Several thousand people have been evacuated from the

Gatlinburg area. Governor Haslam visited Gatlinburg on Tuesday afternoon and got a briefing on the fires.

• On Monday, the U.S. Coast Guard rescued a mariner stranded in a sailboat that had run aground near Cape Puget, Alaska. The sailboat was drifting toward rocks 209 miles north of Kodiak, according to the Coast Guard's 17th District.
