- The chairman of the House Intelligence Committee, Rep. Devin Nunes, R-California, says that he has not seen any "evidence" of contacts between the Trump campaign and the Russian government amid an investigation into Russian activities during the 2016 election.
- ◆ Ryan Alexander Duke, has been arrested in connection with the 2005 disappearance of Georgia high school teacher, Tara Grinstead. Duke was charged with burglary, aggravated assault, murder and concealing a death during his first court appearance last Thursday.

Planning for the Eclipse

There will be a total eclipse of the sun on August 21st. The eclipse will be most visible along a line running from Watts Bar Lake east-southeast through the Niota area. Plans are being made in Polk County and in Sweetwater to attract tourists for the event. Officials in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park have announced plans for the Great American Total Eclipse on Monday, August 21st. The park will have a ticketed event at Clingmans Dome for 1,325 people and informal eclipse viewing sites at Cades Cove and Oconaluftee. The park is teaming up with NASA, Southwestern Community College, and the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians to provide a special event featuring speakers and storytellers who will talk about the science and cultural connection behind the event. At 6,643 feet in elevation, Clingmans Dome offers a unique possibility of seeing the moon's shadow approaching across the landscape. The area will be closed to all public vehicle traffic. The parking area will be converted into a special event site that will include a jumbotron screen for participating in a national NASA TV broadcast, telescopes, exhibits, and a stage for the speakers. Tickets will cost \$30 each. Ticketholders will be shuttled to the site by buses.

TODAY IN HISTORY—FEBRUARY 28th

- **1844 -** The newly-built U.S.S. Princeton exploded while cruising on the Potomac River with top government officials on board. When the ship fired one of its guns to demonstrate the latest in naval armament, the gun exploded, killing the U.S. Secretary of State and Secretary of Navy and several other people. President John Tyler narrowly escaped death.
- **1849 -** The first shipload of gold-seekers arrived in San Francisco after a five-month journey from New York City.
- **1940 -** Race car driver Mario Andretti was born in Italy. He won the Indianapolis 500 race in 1969.
- **1940 -** Singer Joe South was born. His biggest hit was "Walk A Mile In My Shoes."
- **1953 -** Scientists James D. Watson and Francis H.C. Crick discovered the double-helix structure of DNA, the molecule that contains human genes, at Cambridge University.
