



TODAY IN HISTORY - MARCH 29TH

1790 - John Tyler, our 10th President, was born in Virginia. Tyler was the first President to marry while in office.

1867 - Baseball player Cy Young was born in Ohio. He pitched in 906 major league games and won 511. He pitched baseball's first "perfect" game in which the pitcher faces 27 batters in 9 innings and no batter reaches base. After his death, the Cy Young Award was established for the best pitcher in the major leagues each year.

1951 - Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage for passing nuclear secrets to the Soviet Union.
