

♦ McMINN DEPUTIES HONORED

Twenty-three members of the McMinn County Sheriff's Office, who risked their lives during the November tornado, have been honored. Sheriff Joe Guy presented plaques containing the words "I risk my life everyday" to the deputies as a way of thanking them for what they did the night of the tornado. They risked their lives riding 4-wheelers through the dark, despite debris, heavy rain, high wind, and downed power lines to reach Deerfield Estates, where many people were injured. They radioed injury reports to ambulance personnel and actually carried some of the victims from Deerfield Estates to ambulances which were not able to get to the scene. National & World News

- ◆ Attorney General Jeff Sessions announced on Thursday the expansion and modernization of the Department's Institutional Hearing Program (IHP). One of the expansion steps includes bringing immigration judges to correctional facilities rather than having the individual taken to Immigration and Customs Enforcement detention facilities for hearings.
- ♦ The Trump administration has given the U.S. military the authorization to conduct offensive counterterrorism airstrikes in Somalia, targeting al Shabaab.
- ◆ At Thursday's press briefing, White House Press Secretary Sean Spicer invited the chairmen and ranking members of the House and Senate Intelligence committees to the White House to view documents discovered by National Security Council staff.
- ◆ A trial is underway in San Diego involving a lawsuit against Petco after a boy died from a disease contracted from a pet rat purchased from Petco. The boy died in 2013 from rat bite fever two weeks after his pet rat bit him.
