#### **♦ UPDATE ON DOWNTOWN ATHENS FIRE**

It's been nearly two weeks since fire destroyed the former Cantrell law building at Jackson and Washington in Downtown Athens. The fire also caused major smoke and water damage to Johnson's Home Furnishings, the Athens Area Chamber of Commerce, and Greek's Bearing Gifts. Building inspectors have concerns about the structural integrity of the walls adjoining Johnson's and the Chamber. At this point, Johnson's says the damage they suffered was far more extensive than they first thought. The interior and contents were a total loss. The entire showroom inventory is being removed due to smoke and water. From floor to ceiling, the interior will receive a complete renovation which will be a lengthy process. In the meantime, Johnson's Home Furnishing will be operating from their warehouse at 204 East Madison Avenue, just behind their store. They will be open for business to meet your furnishing needs. Johnson's has been operating in Athens since 1932. Emmette Johnson quoted his grandfather who used to say, "Our ship is anchored in Athens." The situation is still unclear for Greeks Bearing Gifts. Patti Greek says they might be able to re-open in 8 to 10 weeks, but she says they really have no idea at this point. The Athens Area Chamber of Commerce is operating temporarily in the basement of the McMinn County Courthouse. The Chamber has met with structural experts. A decision will have to be made on whether the wall between the Cantrell and Chamber buildings will have to be removed.
