

- ♦ A day after President Trump's 'fire and fury' comments, U.S. Secretary of Defense James Mattis cautioned that North Korea's actions "will continue to be grossly overmatched by ours and would lose any arms race or conflict it initiates." Mattis added that North Korean leader Kim Jong-un should "take heed" of the United Nations Security Council's "unified voice," and called for the country to "cease any consideration of actions that would lead to the end of its regime and the destruction of its people."
- ♦ A 17-year-old from Pennsylvania has been charged with second-degree attempted murder after allegedly abandoning her 8-month-old daughter in a plastic bag. The baby girl was found alive under some bushes in a white, plastic kitchen garbage bag. The baby was taken to a local hospital, where she is currently listed in stable condition.
- ◆ Federal authorities executed a search warrant recently on former Trump campaign chairman Paul Manafort. The search warrant, issued by the FBI, stems from the ongoing investigation by special counsel Robert Mueller into Russia's meddling in the presidential election and possible collusion between the Trump campaign and the Russian government.
- ◆ The U.S. Treasury Department announced a new series of sanctions against several members of Venezuela's Constituent Assembly on Wednesday, including the brother of former Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez.

U.S. stocks finished lower today, making it the second day of losses in a row following a streak of 10 straight daily gains for the Dow Jones Industrial Average. Today's weakness was mostly attributed to heightened geopolitical tensions surrounding North Korea. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 37 points to 22,049. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 1 point to 2,474, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 18 points to 6,352.
