- ◆ As Hurricane Harvey "rapidly" intensifies, The National Hurricane Center has issued an advisory instructing Texas residents along the Gulf of Mexico coast to "rush" their storm preparations. The storm is expected to make landfall around 1 a.m. Saturday.
- ◆ A "disgruntled employee" killed an individual at a restaurant in a tourist area in Charleston, South Carolina. The suspect came back to his place of employment with a gun and killed an individual in the restaurant and held another hostage for some time. The suspect was shot by police and has been taken to a hospital in critical con-
- ◆ Russia's ambassador to Sudan, Mirgayas Shirinsky, was found dead at his residence in Khartoum on Wednesday night. Even though there is no evidence to suggest his death is suspicious, Shirinsky is the fourth Russian emissary to die prematurely while overseas on assignment since the start of 2017.
