State & Local News

◆ ATHENS POLICE & FIRE REPORTS

The Athens Police and Fire Departments gave the City Council their reports on activity for the month of August at Tuesday night's Council meeting.

Interim Police Chief Rob Davis reported there were 60 thefts in Athens in August, 16 assaults, 14 burglaries, six motor vehicle thefts, two sex offenses, and one robbery. Police issued 353 citations for moving violations. So far this year, police have written 2889 tickets compared to 3848 for the same period last year. There were 75 traffic accidents in Athens in August, with one fatality and 13 injuries. There are currently seven vacancies on the Police Department.

Athens Fire Chief Jim Dyer reported that firefighters responded to 60 calls in August. One was to a business (Matlock Tire), seven were to vehicle accidents, four were to vehicle fires, and there were 19 false alarms. Losses for the month totaled \$20,500. All of the losses occurred at Matlock Tire--\$15,000 to the building and \$5,500 to a pickup truck inside the building. Chief Dyer reported that firefighters have responded to 454 calls through August of this year, compared to 388 calls through August of last year.
