◆ PLANES TO DROP RABIES VACCINE

For the 16th year, the Tennessee Department of Health is joining with the U.S. Department of Agriculture to distribute rabies vaccine for wild raccoons in East Tennessee. Beginning Saturday, Sept. 30th, vaccine packets will be dropped by airplane and helicopter in McMinn, Meigs, Monroe, Polk, Bradley, and Hamilton counties. The vaccine drop will continue through October 25th. The packets are coated with fishmeal. Although the vaccine products are safe, the USDA says if you or your pet find bait, confine your pet and look for other baits in the area. Wear gloves and toss the bait into a wooded or fencerow area. The bait packets should be removed from places where your pet could easily eat them. Eating the baits won't harm your pet, but consuming several baits might upset your pet's stomach. Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water if there is any chance the vaccine packet has been ruptured. Instruct children to leave baits alone. A warning label on each bait packet advises people not to touch the bait, and contains the rabies information line telephone number.

♦ MINOR INJURIES IN A CAR-BIKE CRASH

Several readers have asked us about an incident last Sunday night in which a bicycle was struck by a car on Congress Parkway at the entrance to Pizza Hut. Interim Police Chief Rob Davis says Mark Lankford, 38, of Athens was riding his bike down the shoulder of Congress Parkway, going south on the northbound side when he was hit by a car. The driver, Gregory Hall of Athens, said he did not see Lankford approach and attempted to pull out onto Congress Parkway. He said it was dark and the bike had no lights on it. Lankford was taken to Starr Regional, treated for minor injuries, and released. Davis says no charges are pending.
