♦ REP. FORGETY TO RETIRE AT END OF TERM

State Rep. John Forgety has announced that he plans to retire from the House of Representatives at the end of his term. At that point, he will have finished his fourth term in the General Assembly. His district includes McMinn County and a part of Monroe County. Rep. Forgety says his decision not to seek re-election is due to concerns over the health of his wife, Faye. Forgety says serving the people of the 23rd District has been an honor and privilege. He says he will be forever grateful that voters have allowed him to serve four terms in the office.



◆ UNEMPLOYMENT UP A BIT IN THE AREA

The unemployment rate in the Athens area rose slightly in November compared to October. The jobless rate in McMinn County was 4.0% in November, up from 3.6% in October. The unemployment rate in Meigs County was 4.1% in November, unchanged from October. Monroe County's jobless rate in November was 3.5%, up from 3.2% in October. Bradley County reported an unemployment rate in November of 3.1%, up from 2.8% in October. In Polk County, the jobless rate was 3.9% in November, up from 3.6% in October. Rhea County's unemployment fell from no. 1 in the state to no. 2, with a 5.4% rate in November.

National & World News

- ◆ 2018 has arrived and is off to a bone-chilling start with at least five deaths, as records fell from the Midwest to the Northeast. The New Year's Day deep freeze encompassed almost the entire eastern two-thirds of the United States. In Lincoln, Nebraska, firefighters battled a house fire in minus 10 degrees as their hoses sprayed water that quickly turned to ice.
- ◆ Two girls who have been missing from their Texas home since Saturday were possible abducted by a 44-year-old man. The girls, identified as Luluvioletta Bandera-Margret, 7, and Lilianais Griffith, 14, were last seen in Round Rock, about 20 miles north of Austin, where they both live. The suspect in the girl's disappearance has been identified as 44-year-old Terry Miles. They may be traveling in a gray 2017 Hyundai Accent with Texas license plate number JGH9845.

1788 - The state of Georgia ratified the Constitution; the fourth state to do so.

1936 - Singer Roger Miller was born. His biggest hit record was "King of the Road."

1959 - Moscow Radio announced that a Russian rocket had been launched to the moon. Luna One never actually landed on the moon. It ended its mission by going into orbit around the sun.

1960 - Sen. John F. Kennedy of Massachusetts announced his candidacy for the Democratic presidential nomination.

1968 - Dr. Christian Barnard performed his second successful heart transplant at Groote Schuur Hospital a month after his first transplant. Dr. Barnard died in 2001.

1974 - President Richard Nixon signed a bill requiring states to lower highway speed limits to 55-miles an hour or lose federal highway funds.

2008 - Crude oil prices soared to \$100 a barrel for the first time.
