

♦ MCMINN CO. TO GET TWO NEW TROOPERS

Fifty cadets have earned their badges officially becoming the newest members of the Tennessee Highway Patrol. The new troopers took their oaths of office after completing 19 weeks of intense physical and classroom training. Two of the new troopers have been assigned to McMinn County. National & World News

- ♦ Officials have ordered about 7,000 people in mountainous areas who were affected by recent wildfires in Southern California to evacuate as an upcoming winter storm poses a threat for mudslides and flash floods. Another 23,000 people are under evacuation warnings.
- ♦ A manhunt is underway in Washington State after a sheriff's deputy was shot and killed while responding to a 911 call late-Sunday night. A suspect has been identified and is on the run.
- ♦ Harsh weather forced a "surge" of rescheduled flights that ultimately knocked out equipment at John F. Kennedy International Airport in New York this past weekend. Several international jets and their passengers were stranded.
- ◆ Eleven Saudi princes were arrested by authorities after they held a protest over the government's decision to stop paying their electric and water bills.

♦ ICY ROADS KEEP POLICE BUSY

The freezing rain that fell in Southeast Tennessee Monday morning kept police and ambulance personnel busy for several hours responding to traffic accidents. McMinn County 911 dispatchers reported that between 7:30 a.m. and 10:45 a.m. there were 22 accidents without injuries and six accidents with injuries. At one point, Highway 163 (the Bowater Road) had to be closed due to slick conditions and several wrecks. There was a wreck with injuries on Highway 39 near the Better Living Center and a wreck with injuries on I-75 between mile markers 45 and 46.

Today In History ~ January 9th **1788 -** Connecticut became the 5th state to ratify the U.S.

1788 - Connecticut became the 5th state to ratify the U.S. Constitution.

1793 - <u>Jean-Pierre Blanchard</u> made the first successful balloon flight in the United States. Blanchard's balloon, filled with hydrogen, took off from Philadelphia, PA, soared to 5,800 feet and eventually wound up some 15 miles away, in Woodbury, New Jersey.

1861 - Mississippi seceded from the Union.

1913 - Richard Nixon, the 37th President, was born. He was a Congressman and Senator from California, served as Vice-President under President Eisenhower, and was elected President in 1968 and re-elected in 1972. He resigned in 1974 while facing almost certain impeachment for his involvement in the Watergate scandal.

2001 - Apple Computer Inc. introduced its iTunes music management software.

2006 - "The Phantom of the Opera" became the longest-running Broadway show with 7,485 performances.
