#### ◆ SUIT FILED AGAINST OPIOID PRODUCERS

Five additional Tennessee district attorneys general have jointly filed a lawsuit against prescription opioid producer Purdue Pharma L.P. and its related companies. The suit was filed in Cumberland County Circuit Court. The suit is also targeted against several pain clinics and their directors, including Mark Murphy, medical director of two pain clinics. Murphy was the nation's top prescriber of oxycodone and OxyContin to Medicare Part D patients in 2015. Tennessee ranks second in the nation for per-capita opioid prescriptions. Unintentional overdose deaths account for more early deaths in Tennessee than automobile accidents, suicides, or homicides. The vast majority of those overdose deaths involve opioids. The lawsuit seeks damages against the defendants for their role in flooding Tennessee with illegal opioids.

- **1628 -** Charles Perrault, author of "Cinderella" and "Sleeping Beauty," was born in Paris. He also wrote "Little Red Riding Hood" and "Tom Thumb." His writings were published in a book titled "Tales of Mother Goose."
- **1905 -** Tex Ritter, singer and cowboy movie star, was born. He sang the Academy Award winning song from the 1952 film, "High Noon."

**THURSDAY'S MARKET REPORT:** U.S. stocks rebounded from Wednesday's losses and closed higher reaching new record highs. In corporate news, Delta Airlines reported higher earnings than expected, pushing the stock price 3.9% higher. In economic news, U.S. producer prices fell for the first time in more than a year. In the bond market, Treasuries mostly rose as yields slipped.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 206 points or 0.8% to 25,575. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 19 points or 0.7% to 2,768, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 58 points or 0.8% to 7,212.

**In Commodity Markets:** The spot price of gold rose \$5.18 to \$1,322.11, and the price of crude oil was unchanged at \$63.57.

**In Bond Markets:** The 30-year Treasury yield closed lower at 2.87% and the 10-year Treasury yield finished lower at 2.54%.
