◆ FATAL WRECK ON COUNTY ROAD 580

A single vehicle crash just before midnight Saturday claimed the life of 20-year-old Raul Cabrera of Athens. Cabrera was a passenger in the rear seat of the 2016 Dodge Charger shown in the photo below. He was not wearing a seat belt and was ejected from the vehicle and died upon impact. The driver, 21-year-old Cynthia E. Villarreal of Etowah, told Trooper William Patterson of the THP that she swerved to miss an animal and lost control, ran off the roadway and struck a tree. Another passenger, 26-year-old Camilo C. Villarreal of Etowah, was injured. Ms. Villarreal was cited and may face criminal charges. She and Camilo Villarreal were both wearing seat belts.
