

Cochran Makes It Official

Mark Cochran has made it official. He will seek the Republican

nomination for State Representative in the 23rd District which includes McMinn County and part of Monroe County. This is the seat currently held by Rep. John Forgety, who is retiring at the end of his current term. Cochran savs McMinn County has been home to his family for over 160 years. He is a self-described conservative and vows to be an advocate for individual and religious liberty in the state legislature. Cochran has served as Assistant to the McMinn County Mayor since 2010. He served two terms as chair-



man of the McMinn County Republican Party and is currently the chairman of C.A.G.E., the Community Action Group of Englewood. Cochran is the second candidate to enter the race. Athens attorney Trey Winder, III, has also tossed his hat into the ring.

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT:

Stocks were solidly higher on the day as the Dow Jones and NASDAQ Indexes posted gains exceeding 1%. Apple rose nearly 2% after the company announced plans to repatriate billions in cash held overseas, contributing \$350 billion to the U.S. economy over the next five years.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 323 points or 1.3% to 26,116. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 26 points or 0.9% to 2,803, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 75 points or 1.0% to 7,298.

In Bond Markets, the 30-year Treasury yield closed higher at 2.84% and the 10-year Treasury yield finished higher at 2.57%. In Commodity markets, the spot price of gold fell \$9.53 to \$1,328.90, and the price of crude oil rose \$0.17 to \$63.90.
