## The Battle of Depot Hill

This Sunday, January 28th, marks the 153rd anniversary of a Civil War battle fought in Athens. About 300 Confederates attacked the Federal Garrison, a union fort located in the area along Ohio Avenue behind the present J-Pro on Depot Hill. The fort overlooked the Athens depot and railway. Confederate forces attacked the fort and took about 20 prisoners with a loss of about 50 killed and wounded. The Federal loss was six wounded. The Confederates came from the direction of Woodward Avenue and the old Athens Table Company. They set up artillery around the present YMCA area and staged a surprise attack on the fort. The Confederates then proceeded to overrun the square and looted some stores. Most of the prisoners captured by the Confederate raiders at Athens were eventually sent to a prison in Andersonville, Georgia. The Federal forces were at a disadvantage because they were without cannon and without horses to pursue the Confederates when they withdrew. Eventually, Federal forces regrouped outside of town and pursued the Confederate raiders into the mountains of North Carolina.
