
◆ At least five people were killed early Sunday morning in a shooting outside a self-serve car wash in a rural western Pennsylvania town. The shooting occurred in Melcroft, about 55 miles southeast of Pittsburgh, around 2:40 a.m.

◆ The Michigan attorney general has announced a broad investigation to find out "who knew what and when" about any sexual assault claims against Larry Nassar, a former athletic trainer for Michigan State University and the USA Gymnastics team's doctor. Nassar was sentenced to 40 up to 175 years in prison for sexually assaulting young women in his care. More than 150 women testified or submitted victim-impact statements about abuse they suffered at the hands of Nassar. Nasser is already facing a 60 year prison sentence for possessing child pornography.

◆ A 32-year-old man in Mumbai, India died after being "sucked" into a hospital's MRI machine. The victim walked into the room that contained the MRI machine while he was holding a metal oxygen cylinder.
