♦ WACKER RESUMES OPERATIONS

The WACKER plant in Charleston has resumed operations for the production of polysilicon. It will be a "phase in" process beginning with distillation. The initial production of polysilicon is expected to begin in the next few weeks. Production was suspended last September when a mechanical failure due to a fractured compressor piston caused an explosion.
