### NEW MEDICARE CARDS ARE COMING

If you are a beneficiary of Medicare, check your mail very carefully. The McMinn Senior Center advises that you will be receiving a new Medicare card with an important new identification number soon. In April, Medicare began to issue all 60 million of its beneficiaries new cards with new ID numbers as a way to combat identity theft and fraud. The ID number will be different from your Social Security number. The new Medicare Beneficiary Identifier (MBI) will be an 11-character string with random numbers and capital letters. It will take about a year for Medicare to send out all the new cards. When you receive it, you should shred the old one.
