#### **♦ TBI RELEASES SCHOOL CRIME STUDY**

The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation has released a new study detailing the volume and nature of crime on K-12 campuses across the state. The report compiles three years of crime data submitted to the TBI by the state's law enforcement agencies. Among the findings of "School Crime 2015-2017":

- From 2015 to 2017, a total of 27,038 offenses were reported at Tennessee schools.
- The number of offenses occurring in schools increased 13.5%, from 8,484 in 2015 to 9,642 in 2017.
- Simple assault was the most frequently reported offense, accounting for 37.4% of the offenses.
- The month of September had the highest frequency of reported school crimes.
- White males accounted for 57.3% of offenders. Females accounted for 52.8% of the victims.
- The most common weapon type was "personal weapons (hands, fist, feet, etc)," at 80.1%.

The TBI director, Mark Gwyn, says the study will hopefully assist law enforcement, school administrations, and government officials in planning their efforts in the fight against crime and continue to create awareness that crime exists as a threat to our communities.

◆ A Dixon, Illinois school resource officer stopped an armed teenager at a high school Wednesday morning. When confronted, the suspect ran and fired several rounds at the officer. The officer pursued the gunman and took him into custody with what's believed to be non-life-threatening injuries. Dixon police chief Steven Howell said the officer's "heroic actions" possibly saved "countless" lives.
