#### ◆ ARREST MADE IN ETOWAH MURDER

An arrest has been made in the murder of an Etowah teenager, 18-year-old Kelsey Burnett, nearly a year ago. A male juvenile, Joseph Wielzen of Etowah, has been booked into the McMinn County Jail on charges of second degree murder and rape. Miss Burnette disappeared while walking in the early morning hours of July 1st, 2017. A citizen discovered her body off the side of Charles Street on July 4th. The TBI and the Etowah Police Department launched an investigation which eventually identified Wielzen as the person responsible for her death. An autopsy revealed Ms. Burnett's cause of death was a result of multiple severe blows to the head. Red paint was found on her skull that matched red paint on a metal baseball bat found near her body.

## Three Die in Train-Car Crash

Three people were killed last Thursday afternoon when their car was struck by a train at a railroad crossing north of Calhoun. They were identified as 45-year-old Wendy Humphreys of Chattanooga, 46-year-old Johnny Ashworth of Chattanooga, and 17-year-old Jasmine Ashworth of Calhoun, Georgia. The Tennessee Highway Patrol says they were heading north on Highway 11 and tried to cross the tracks on a private road where there are no lights or crossing arms. That's when a Norfolk Southern train with three engines and 40 cars hit their car. The THP says the impact knocked the car off the tracks and down an embankment, where it landed on its top. All three victims had to be cut from the vehicle.
