- ◆ The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has requested that the Pentagon house migrants crossing the U.S.-Mexico border at Fort Bliss, a military base in El Paso and at Goodfellow Air Force Base in San Angelo, also in Texas.
- ◆ At least 52 wildfires are burning throughout the Western United States, including Alaska. Very hot and dry conditions have ignited dozens of fires from Texas to Oregon to California, forcing numerous evacuations.
