♦ STORMS PACK A "DOUBLE WHAMMY"

The Athens area received a "double whammy" of stormy weather,

with heavy rain and high winds Wednesday evening and more heavy rainstorms and street flooding Thursday morning. The Wednesday storms blew down lots of trees and knocked out power to downtown Athens and to the E&E and Adient plants in the Highway 307 area. Thursday morning the intense rain caused flooding on several streets in Athens and numerous County Roads. Downtown

National & World News

• Five people are dead and several others are injured after a shooting at the *Capital Gazette*, in Annapolis, Maryland. The suspect was taken into custody. No gunfire was exchanged between the suspect, an adult male, and police officers.

In elections held on Tuesday in New York's 14th Congressional Disctrict, Representative Joseph Crowley, fourth-ranking house democrat, was upset by Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, a former campaign organizer for Bernie Sanders who ran as a progressive socialist. Representative Dan Donovan, a republican representing the 11th district of New York held off a challenge from felon and former congressman Michael Grimm. In South Carolina, Governor Henry McMaster won his primary runoff.

BURGLARS HIT CLASSIC LANES

Two people are under arrest following a burglary early Thursday morning at the Classic Lanes Bowling Alley on Congress Parkway. Officers responded to a burglar alarm and arrested one suspect near the scene by using a TASER. The second suspect was found hiding in a wooded area. They were identified as David McCoy and Gabriel O'Daniel. They face charges of burglary, theft of property over \$1,000, evading arrest and vandalism.
