◆ SCHOOLS TO GET SECURITY FUNDING

The State of Tennessee has promised to give schools more safety funding after a number of school shootings across the country. Under the Safe Schools Act, each school district is responsible for evaluating its safety needs and deciding the best way to use the money, including violence prevention, training and drills, behavioral health, and needed security improvements. The state has divided \$25 million across all districts in the state, based on student population. The McMinn County Schools will get \$135,500. Athens City Schools will receive \$41,160. Etowah City School gets \$10,170. The Monroe County Schools will receive \$136,750. The school districts will also put forward set amounts of money as a "local match."

- ◆ A federal judge approved a jury of six men and six women selected to hear Special Counsel Robert Mueller's case against former Trump campaign chairman Paul Manafort. The panel that will decide his fate was picked from a part of Virginia that voted heavily against Trump.
- ◆ President Trump asked General John Kelly to stay on as White House chief of staff through his 2020 re-election campaign. Kelly told senior administration staff that he has accepted the president's request to remain on as chief of staff through 2020.
- ♦ Homeland Security Secretary Kirstjen Nielsen issued one of her strongest warnings yet to Russia and other adversaries to stop interfering with United States democracy. Nielsen said the United States will no longer tolerate their interference. She warned them, "You will be exposed. And, you will pay a high price."


