After speaking with witnesses, officers determined that Lusane had been involved in an argument with a 17year-old male. The 17-year-old left the area and returned with another male, who has yet to be identified. The other male produced a shotgun and shot Lusane in the thigh. Lusane was transported to the hospital with non life-threatening wounds. The 17year-old male has been identified. Officers are actively pursuing leads in the case.
