♦ ETOWAH TO GET PARKS GRANT

Governor Haslam has announced a \$375,000 grant to construct a new 30' x 60' swimming pool and pool house at Etowah City Park. The grant will require a \$375,000 local match.

◆ DRUG DEATHS RISE IN TENNESSEE

The number of Tennessee residents who died of drug overdoses rose eight percent in 2017, setting another record. A total of 1,776 Tennesseans died from overdoses last year. Three-fourths of the deaths were associated with opioids. More than half of those involved prescription pain killers. There was a 70% increase in deaths associated with fentanyl, which is similar to heroin but more potent and dangerous.

♦ FUEL PUMP CAUSED HELICOPTER CRASH

The National Transportation Safety Board's final report on a deadly crash of a sightseeing helicopter in Pigeon Forge in 2016 concluded the helicopter's fuel pump led to the crash. The report says the fuel pump failed because of a lack of adequate grease, possibly because an incorrectly-sized spacer had been installed and may have led to a gap that allowed the grease to drain out. Five people were killed in the crash.

National & World News

- ◆ A first-degree murder charge was filed on Tuesday against 24-year-old Cristhian Rivera, an undocumented immigrant, in the case of missing Iowa jogger Mollie Tibbetts. Rivera lives in the rural area where the college student vanished one month ago. Tibbetts body was recovered Tuesday morning in a farm field.
- ◆ Al-Qaeda's chief bomb maker is believed to have been killed in a U.S. drone strike in Yemen. Ibrahim al-Asiri, a 36-year-old Saudi national, was considered one of the top terrorist bomb makers in the world by U.S. and western counterterrorism experts.

1955 Tragedy Remembered

On August 22, 1955, a Spring City school bus was struck by a train. Forty-seven children were on the bus. Eleven of them were killed. The railroad crossing had lights and bells, but no crossing guards. The bus had just left Spring City Elementary School which was three blocks east of the railroad tracks. **Morning Fax** editor Bob Ketchersid was a student at Spring City High School. His mother taught 3rd grade. They arrived at the crash scene just minutes after the accident. Bob says the memories remain vivid in his mind even to this day. He knew several of the children who were on the bus. A few days later, Governor Frank Clement led a memorial service at the Spring City railroad depot. Bob was a member of the band which participated in the memorial service.
