State & Local News

◆ ATHENS POLICE & FIRE REPORTS

The Athens City Council heard the reports on activity for July by the police and fire departments at its Tuesday evening meeting. - Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 39 thefts in July, 21 assaults, 20 burglaries, and six motor vehicle thefts. Police issued citations for 184 moving violations. There were 79 traffic accidents in July, with 12 injuries. Through July there had been 585 traffic accidents compared to 504 for the same period last year. There had been 104 injuries through July this year, up sharply from 73 injuries for the same period last year. There are currently four vacancies on the Athens police department.

- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 83 calls in July. Thirteen were to vehicle accidents, five were trash fires, two were to residential fires, and there were 30 false alarms. Losses for the month totaled \$65,900.

♦ LOCAL POWER RATES TO FALL

Athens Utilities Board reports electricity rates for September will drop by about 2.5% compared to current August power rates. The drop is based on a lower TVA fuel charge. AUB's Wayne Scarbrough says the fuel cost is lower based on TVA's ability to generate more power using cheap hydro sources--a result of increased rainfall in the Tennessee Valley--and low-cost natural gas, which TVA uses at several generating units to make electric power.

National & World News

- ◆ White House press secretary Sarah Sanders insisted Wednesday that President Trump has done "nothing wrong" relating to statements made by Michael Cohen, his former personal lawyer, about illegal campaign contributions. Trump stated that the payments were not made with campaign funds.
- ◆ Cristhian Rivera, the alleged killer of Mollie Tibbetts, made a court appearance on Wednesday but did not enter a plea. Rivera is an undocumented immigrant from Mexico, and had worked for four years at Yarrabee Farms and had passed the government's background check. Yarrabee said they had no idea he was an undocumented immigrant. Bond was set for \$5 million, cash only, and an immigration hold was also filed on Rivera.

The 30-year Treasury yield closed lower at 2.98% and the 10-year Treasury yield finished lower at 2.82%.
