

◆ VACCINE PACKETS TO BE AIR-DROPPED

The Tennessee Department of Health has begun its annual drop of rabies vaccination packets from the air in several counties, includ-

ing McMinn, Meigs, Monroe, Polk, and Bradley. The vaccine packets are being dropped from airplanes and helicopters through October 20th. The vaccine distribution will target rural areas where raccoons are likely to eat. The USDA Wildlife Services says



the packets will not harm our pet, but eating several packets might upset your pet's stomach. They suggest you wear gloves and pick up the packets and throw them into an area away from your pets.

♦ THIRD ENGLEWOOD EMPLOYEE OUITS

In less than a week, three employees of the City of Englewood have resigned. The first to step down was Police Chief James Paris. Last Friday, the interim city manager, Sherri Denton, turned in her letter of resignation. Then on Monday, the Englewood City Recorder resigned. A common denominator behind the resignations apparently involves interference from and unfair treatment by some of the Englewood City Commissioners.

The message will read "Presidential Alert: This is a test of the National Wireless Emergency Alert System. No action is needed."
- ◆ Two envelopes, addressed to Defense Secretary James Mattis and Chief of Naval Operations Admiral John Richardson, were flagged as part of the Pentagon's normal processing procedures and are being examined to determine whether they test positive for the deadly poison ricin.
