- ◆ As the international outrage grows over the disappearance and suspected murder of Washington Post journalist Jamal Khashoggi, a number of international business leaders and media companies are backing out of an upcoming Saudi high-profile investment conference. The conference is scheduled to begin October 23rd in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia and provides a global platform that explores the future of global investments.
- ◆ North and South Korea have agreed to rebuild connections between railways and roads that were severed more than 60 years ago during the Korean War. This is part of a broad agreement between South Korean President Moon Jae-in and North Korean leader Kim Jong Un.
- ◆ Prince Harry and Meghan Markle, The Duke and Duchess of Sussex, are expecting a baby in the Spring of 2019.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks began the week lower as the market sell-off continued amid concerns about a less accommodative Federal Reserve. In economic news, U.S. retail sales rose 0.1% in September. In corporate news, Sears filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection and will close 142 unprofitable stores near year-end.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 89 points or 0.4% to 25,251. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 16 points or 0.4% to 2,751, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 66 points or 0.9% to 7,431.
