♦ PRESIDENT TO VISIT CHATTANOOGA

President Donald Trump is scheduled to visit Chattanooga for a rally this coming Sunday. The purpose of the rally is to help Republican Marsha Blackburn in her November 6th battle with Democrat Phil Bredesen to become Tennessee's next U.S. Senator. Details of the president's visit have not yet been released. That same day, November 4th, the president will be in Macon, Georgia, where Republican Brian Kemp and Democrat Stacy Abrams are locked in a tight race to become Georgia's next governor. Trump's visits are aimed at making the difference in close races.

◆ UNEMPLOYMENT RATE MOSTLY DOWN

The unemployment rate went down in 70 of Tennessee's 95 counties in September. It was up slightly in 10 and unchanged in the others. The lowest unemployment rate was 2.7 percent in Williamson County. The highest rate was 6.5 percent in Lauderdale County. Here in the Athens area, the jobless rate in McMinn County was 4.2 percent in September, down slightly from 4.3 percent in August. Meigs County's unemployment rate in September was 4.5 percent, down from 4.7 percent in August. In Monroe County, the unemployment rate in September was 3.9 percent, unchanged from August. Polk County reported a jobless rate in September of 4.1 percent, down from 4.4 percent in August. Bradley County's unemployment rate in September was 3.8 percent, down from 4.0 percent in August.

- ◆ A boy was shot dead at a North Carolina high school Monday morning after a bullying conflict "escalated out of control." One student, a 16-year-old boy in the ninth-grade, was taken into custody and charged with first-degree murder, for allegedly killing a tenth-grader.
- ◆ A ninth child died late Saturday night at the Wanague Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation in Haskell, New Jersey. This latest death was a confirmed case of adenovirus, a respiratory disease with symptoms that may include a sore throat, pneumonia, diarrhea, pink eye, fever, and inflammation of the stomach and intestines.
