◆ PELLEY UPSET OVER COMMITTEE JOBS

City Councilman Dick Pelley is not happy over the committee appointments that were approved at Tuesday night's Council meeting. Pelley, who had been stripped of his committee posts in punitive action taken by the council earlier this year, was named to one committee--the Athens Parks Foundation. He was not appointed to committees that he had been removed from last April. Other council members serve on at least two committees. For the first time in a number of years, the council appointed non-council members to serve on committees that normally are appointments given to active council members. Pelley says Mayor Chuck Burris indicated that he was burying the hatchet. Pelley was re-elected in November. He says his supporters are being denied his experience and training on those committees. Pelley says he wonders if that is burying the hatchet or "digging it in deeper?"
