♦ AUB RELEASES ANNUAL WATER REPORT

The Athens Utilities Board has completed its annual Water Quality Report. The report includes information on the origin and treatment of AUB water. For the year 2018, AUB water quality exceeded all state and federal water quality standards. AUB-supplied drinking water comes from Ingleside Spring and from wells that tap an underground aquifer that parallels Oostanaula Creek in Athens. Water from those sources is treated at AUB's filter plant. A third water source is the Hiwassee Utility Commission, which supplements AUB's water supply with treated surface water from the Hiwassee River. The report is available on AUB's website and at the AUB main office on New Englewood Road.

♦ MORE HANDGUN LEGISLATION

What do you do if you're legally allowed to carry a handgun and you accidentally walk into a business where a "no firearms" sign is posted? Under Tennessee law, you've just committed a misdemeanor. State Rep. Clark Boyd says you should not be punished for an accident. He has introduced a bill that would grant mercy to someone who ignores posted "no firearms" signs at businesses, but did not mean to. He cited a situation when a person carrying a handgun might have to chase after their child who has run into the store. He says the moment you step through the door, you've committed a crime. Opponents of the bill say it would give an excuse for handgun carry permit holders to ignore the law.

Downtown "Penthouse"

If you've been in Downtown Athens in recent weeks, you've no doubt wondered about that "penthouse-like" structure being built on top of one of the old two-story buildings on North White

Street across from the Courthouse. Joseph Gordon and his wife, Kelley, have bought the building and are in the process of remodeling it. They decided to build an apartment to live in on top of the building, along with two other apartments they can rent. Their plans also call for offices and retail space in the building which dates back to the late 1800's. They are also planning to redo the façade of





the building to recreate it's original appearance. The Gordon's are pictured at left during a recent appearance on WYXI Radio. Elaine Newman took the photo showing the "penthouse" apartment still under construction. Joseph says he hopes to have the top apartment finished in about six months.

COCHRAN PASSES FIRST BILL

State Representative Mark Cochran of Englewood has officially passed his first bill as a member of the Tennessee General Assembly. House Bill 362 requires, upon passage of an annexation resolution or de-annexation ordinance, a municipality to provide documentation to the Comptroller of the Treasury and county officials. Rep. Cochran says the legislation will ensure our state and county governments have the most accurate information related to their municipalities and will improve communication between all forms of government.
