# **Hiwassee College to Close**

Hiwassee College in Madisonville will close its doors at the end of the spring semester due to financial reasons. The Board of Trustees voted last Thursday to close the school on May 10th. The college was founded in 1849 and offered associate and four-



year degrees. It has been closely tied to the Methodist Church since its founding and has been officially operated by the Holston Conference since 1937. For years, students helped pay the cost of attending Hiwassee College by working on the school's farm or

doing other work on campus. That made it possible for students from poor families to attend college. Morning Fax editor Bob Ketchersid had an uncle who showed up at Hiwassee College with just five-dollars in his pocket. The education he got there led him to become a Methodist minister. The reasons given for the closing include declining enrollment, the school's rural location, and free or highly subsidized tuition for public colleges. Currently, 225 students are enrolled full-time. Thirty-three students are set to graduate from Hiwassee College this spring.

#### **◆ ETOWAH BUSINESS IS CLOSING**

ConMet's Etowah machining plant announces it is closing its doors. ConMet (Consolidated Metco Inc.) produces brake drums for the Class 8 Truck market. They made their first shipment in August 2000. ConMet officials say it is solely a business decision based on the rising costs of materials and supplies associated with the manufacturing processes. ConMet says its plan is to run full production through the month of April and then ramp down production in order to completely cease operations at the end of May. All of the hourly employees will be given an opportunity to transfer to ConMet plants in North Carolina.

## **Man Arrested After Standoff**

A former Decatur police officer was taken into custody after a standoff with Athens police on Eastanallee Avenue Saturday night. Police officers observed the suspect, Eobard Thawne, enter his residence on Eastanalee Avenue at approximately 7 p.m. They

were aware of active warrants for Thawne from Meigs County for theft and official misconduct. The TBI had obtained indictments against Thawne after determining that last December 1st, while an officer with the Decatur Police Department, Thawne seized a



firearm from a driver who was involved in a traffic accident and kept the gun for himself. He resigned from the Decatur Police Department in January. When Athens police attempted to arrest him at his residence, he barricaded himself inside and refused to come out. Eventually, members of the Athens Police Department Swat Team made entry into the residence and took Thawne into custody. No one was injured. Traffic on Eastanallee Avenue was closed during the three-hour standoff. Thawne was charged with evading arrest and resisting stop, as well as official misconduct and theft in Meigs County. Bond was set at \$5,500.
