# **Rules for Skating in Athens**

The warm weather is bringing out the roller skaters and skateboarders in Athens. There are rules for both of these activities. The Municipal Code says that no skateboarding or roller skating is allowed on public property (property owned or maintained by the City of Athens) within the downtown business district which is defined as the area within the boundaries of Green Street, College Street. Hill Street and Park Street. The ban includes streets and sidewalks and other public property. The ban also includes any property, wherever located, that is owned or maintained by any public utility. Skating is not permitted on private property where signs are posted prohibiting it. That includes parking areas. The owners of private property must submit a written application to the City of Athens requesting a designation of a no skating area. REMINDER: The City does have a skateboard park located next to the swimming pool on Forrest Avenue.

#### BOAT REGISTRATION FEES TO INCREASE

The cost of registering a boat in Tennessee will increase effective July 1st. The fee for a 16-foot boat and under will go up from \$13 to \$15 for one year.

**WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT** 

U.S. stocks ended the day lower. Energy and financial sectors were the largest drags on performance. Corporate news was light. The May Consumer Price Index increased 0.1%, and was lower than April but in-line with consensus estimates. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 44 points or 0.2% to 26,005. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 6 points or 0.2% to 2,880, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 30 points or 0.4% to 7,793.

#### **♦ JULY 1st MEANS NO HAND-HELD PHONES**

Tennessee's new ban on hand-held cell phones takes effect in nearly 2 weeks. Starting July 1st, drivers cannot hold cell phones while they are behind the wheel. However, hands free or Bluetooth calls will still be allowed. Drivers will not be allowed to scroll through social media while at a red light or try to punch in an address for directions. Last year, there were more than 24,600 crashes involving distracted drivers in Tennessee. That averages out to 67 crashes ever single day. Statistics for McMinn County for the last 10 years show a total of 1,301 distracted driving crashes. The highest number was 159 in 2017.
