Higher Education Center Gets the OK

The McMinn County Higher Education Center has gotten the green light. The State Building Commission has approved the final plans for the new center, which will be a collaborative effort among the Tennessee College of Applied Technology-Athens, Cleveland State Community College, the UT Extension Service, Adult Education, the McMinn County and Athens City Governments and local industry. The new Higher Education Center will be located across the road from the DENSO plant. The property was donated by the McMinn County Economic Development Council. McMinn County provided the equivalent of \$1 million toward the project. The City of Athens contributed \$165,000. The total cost of the project is \$17.75 million. Officials hope to break ground in September. State Senator Mike Bell says state approval of the final plans is the culmination of seven years of work between local and state leaders. State Rep. Mark Cochran says the Center will be an incredible tool for developing a workforce to serve the needs of industries in the Athens area. The facility will include classrooms and laboratories.
