





TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks closed lower as investors assessed weak economic data and commentary from Federal Reserve officials. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 179 points or 0.7% to 26,548. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 28 points or 0.9% to 2,917, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 121 points or 1.5% to 7,885.
