

Emma Martin, 51, of McMinn County has been charged with TennCare fraud in connection with selling prescription drugs she obtained using TennCare benefits. Martin was arrested by the Office of the Inspector General and the McMinn County Sheriff's office. She's charged with using TennCare to obtain the painkiller, Oxycodone, and the anti-anxiety medication Xanax. Authorities say she sold some of the drugs during an undercover drug operation.
