## Local and Area News

#### **♦** FIVE MORE DAYS OF EARLY VOTING

Early voting for the August 20th Athens Sales Tax Referendum continues through this Thursday, August 15th. At the close of voting this past Saturday, 532 people had voted early. For comparison, there are 7,057 registered voters and 122 property rights voters in Athens. Early voting takes place at the McMinn County Election Commission office on the ground floor of the Courthouse. A lot of people have not yet made up their minds about whether to vote in favor of a 0.75 percent increase in the sales tax. They've also heard that the property tax will go up, whether or not the sales tax increase is approved. In hopes of helping to clarify any confusion, WYXI Radio will have Athens City Manager C. Seth Sumner and Athens School Director Dr. Melanie Miller live in the studio this Monday morning at 8:15 a.m. right after the 8 o'clock news. They will be explaining how the revenue will be used if the sales tax increase is approved, what will happen if it is defeated, and how a possible property tax increase figures into the whole equation. They will also be asked about the effect on revenue from a sales tax increase if the county commission decides to extend the sales tax increase to all of McMinn County.

#### **♦** WRECK CAUSES ENGLEWOOD OUTAGE

Athens Utilities Board had to spend about 6 hours to repair the damage to a 3 phase power pole on Highway 39 East near Nonaberg Sunday morning. The pole was struck by a vehicle at around 3 a.m. No injuries were reported.

## **Dangerous Prison Escapee Captured**

✓ The top news story in Tennessee over the weekend was the capture of 44 yearold Curtis Ray Watson. Watson was spotted early Sunday morning. Watson is suspected of killing Tennessee Department of Correction Administrator Debra Johnson at her residence on the grounds of the



West Tennessee State Penitentiary in Henning last Wednesday. Watson was an inmate at the prison and escaped from a work detail on a tractor. The TBI has secured warrants for Watson for first-degree murder, burglary, and sexual battery. Governor Lee announced the State of Tennessee would offer a reward of \$25,000 for information leading to the capture and conviction of Watson. The FBI and U.S. Marshals also contributed \$10,000 each plus \$2,500 from the TBI and \$5,000 from the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms for a total. Other agencies contributed as well. The total reward money was at least \$57,000.

## **Opioid overdoses on the Rise**

◆ In 2017, more than 1,700 people died in the state of Tennessee from drug overdoses. Athens police are using a new tool to try and save lives from opioid abuse. Officers now carry Narcan nasal spray which can counteract opioid overdoses. Monday a week ago, officers responded to the Athens Lodge off Highway 305 near the interstate where they found a man on the bathroom floor, unresponsive. Officers say Narcan nasal spray brought him around and three minutes later he regained consciousness. Athens Police Chief Cliff Couch says the opioid crisis has arrived in Athens. Couch says his officers have been called out to nearly a dozen overdoses so far in 2019. Chief Couch says he needs more resources. As of today, 32 officers are currently on the beat in Athens. Couch says he needs six more officers. Athens police are stepping up drug sweeps to get drugs out of the city. Drugrelated arrests have consistently increased over the last three years. Officers took 176 people into custody in 2016. Two years later that number jumped to 247. As of July 2019, they have arrested nearly 260
