

# Wielzen Trial Set for Nov. 13th

The trial for Joseph Wielzen has been tentatively set for November 13th. Wielzen is accused in the death of 18-year-old Kelsey Burnette of Etowah. Her body was found in July of 2017. Wielzen appeared in court on Monday. His attorney, Andy Brown, says the court is dragging its feet when it comes to a speedy trial. He blames the delay of the trial, in part, on lost evidence. Transcripts from previous court hearings show that pictures of the house where the crime is believed to have taken place are missing. The attorney also claims that stains that appear to be blood and the defendant's own DNA sample were not tested for over a year. Brown's motion claims the DA's office is "trampling" on the defendant's right to a speedy trial.

The rise was about 0.3% in both June and July. Treasury bond prices fell. Interest rates rose. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 382 points or 1.5% to 26,264. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 43 points or 1.5% to 2,924, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 153 points or 1.9% to 8,011.
