



### **Photos of Fatal Wreck Scene**

An Athens woman, 56-year-old Linda Greer, was killed Tuesday

afternoon when the car she was riding in made a left turn on U.S. 11 at Shoemaker. Her car was hit by an oncoming McMinn County Sheriff's Department patrol car driven by Deputy Ashley McClendon. The impact caused the Greer car to overturn, eject-



ing the victim. The car then landed on top of her. She was not wearing a seat belt. Troopers say if she had been, she probably would have survived the crash. She was reported dead at the scene. The Tennessee Highway Patrol released these photos.



### **Community News You Can Use**

- ✓ Early voting has ended for the Athens Sales Tax Referendum which will be held on August 20th. At the close of voting Thursday evening, 879 people voted early, not including property rights and absentee ballots. There is slightly over 7,000 registered voters in the city of Athens.
- ✓ The Athens Public Works Department has explained why the traffic light has not yet been installed at the intersection of Railroad Avenue and Tellico Avenue which has been a 4-way stop intersection for the last several months. The Public Works Department says the Tennessee Department of Transportation and their contractor are waiting on materials. The estimated completion time is now the 4th Quarter of 2019, which would be sometime between October and the end of December. The Public Works Department also clarified a news release that said one lane of Washington Avenue and the parking spaces on the rear side of the Courthouse would be closed through this Saturday afternoon. They now say the closing is intermittent whenever a crane is needed for a roof replacement project.
- ✓ The Heritage School at the McMinn Living Heritage Museum tomorrow will feature J. Ross Greene, author of "A Fortress & A Legacy," a book about a WWII bombardier's story of faith and service. The program goes from 10:30 a.m. to 12 noon. It is free to museum members and \$5 for non members.
- ✓ Sounds of Summer will take place Saturday at 7 p.m. at the Market Park Pavilion. Admission is free. Bring your lawn chairs. This week's performers are Wild Blue Yonder and Kyle & Maya.
