✓ E.G Fisher Public Library will have a free "Introduction to Facebook" today (Wednesday) at 10 a.m. Call 745-7782 to register.



TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks closed slightly lower. The financials sector weighed on markets as bond yields declined and the yield curve flattened. August consumer confidence fell to 135.1, but remains strong overall. A District Judge in Oklahoma ruled against Johnson & Johnson in an opioid case forcing the company to pay \$572 million to the state. Bond yields declined. The yield curve remained inverted.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 121 points or 0.5% to 25,778. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 9 points or 0.3% to 2,869, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 27 points or 0.3% to 7,827.
