WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. equities closed higher. The energy sector led the rally, supported by rising oil prices. The technology and utility sectors lagged the broad markets. U.S. government data showed crude stockpiles fell steeply by 10 million barrels last week. The 10-year and two-year yields lowered slightly. The yield curve remained inverted.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 258 points or 1.0% to 26,035. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 19 points or 0.7% to 2,888, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 30 points or 0.4% to 7,857.
